Art of Humanity event to honor The Season for Non-violence in ViBe Creative District



(Virginia Beach, VA) January 23, 2023—The Season for Nonviolence Collective, NAMI Coastal Virginia, VB Human Rights Commission, StandUp for Kids Hampton Roads and ViBe Creative District nonprofit announced today that the public is welcome to participate in a small ceremony called The Art of Humanity Event on Monday, January 30th at 5pm to celebrate the opening of The Season for Nonviolence. All people are welcome to attend the dedication of a new planter bench in the Season for Nonviolence Parklet at the corner of 20th St and Cypress Avenue. Local students will read speeches and share hand painted kindness rocks to spread the message of mental well-being and nonviolence. Volunteers will conduct a ceremonial planting in the new wooden bench built by local Virginia Beach vocational technology students in honor of those who have lost their lives to violence

in the past year. Free resources will be handed out regarding mental health awareness and Season For Nonviolence readings, music and activities. This event is free and open to the public.

The Season for Nonviolence is celebrated annually from January 30 to April 4 as a national 64-day educational, media, and grassroots campaign dedicated to demonstrating that non-violence is a powerful way to heal, transform, and empower our lives and our communities.

SEASON FOR NONVIOLENCE COLLECT VB:

This student-led group is guided by local educators, VB Human Rights Commissioners, and other partners to implement best practices within their schools and communities centered on raising awareness for mental health well-being and cultivating a culture of nonviolence. Participating school leaders can earn Season for Nonviolence Flags for their schools.

A local girl scout troop will lead clean up efforts in ViBe District gardens during the Season as a peaceful activity to foster community-building and civic leadership.
